Squiggle to Wiggle

Runs with spatial awareness and negotiates space,
adjust speed or direction to avoid obstacles

Throw and catch a large ball, beanbag or an object.
Hold pencil/paint brush beyond whole hand grasp.

Draw lines and circles using gross motor movements.

To make marks on paper.

Cut along a straight line with scissors

Begin to handle tools, objects, construction and
malleable materials with increasing control.

Can say how physical activity effects their body.

Can name and identify different parts of the body.

Can ask questions about where they live and the natural world.

Can talk about what happens in Autumn.

Understands growth, decay and changes over time.

Shows care for living things and the environment.
