Beatrix Potter was born on 28th July 1866 in London, England.

She was an author who wrote 22 children's books.

Beatrix Potter studied plants and animals.

She fell in love with the Lakes because she came her for summer holidays when she was a little girl.

Beatrix made her books small enough for little children to read and colourful so they would be fun to look at.

This lady bought farms and land to save it from being built upon so everyone could enjoy the countryside and how beautiful it was.

She left nearly all her property to the National Trust, including over 4,000 acres (16 km²) of land, sixteen farms, cottages and herds of cattle and Herdwick sheep

She died on 22nd December 1943.
